INFORMATION & RULES

The Show will be run under the rules and regulations of the Royal Agricultural Society, Waikato A&P Association and the RAS Equestrian rulebook.

It shall be deemed acceptable as if they had been reprinted in full in this schedule.

A copy of these rules is available for perusal at the Secretary's office or on the RAS website.

COMPLULSORY HELMET REQUIREMENT: Please go to the RAS website for details. www.ras.org.nz

Entries close: 17/10/2025- late entries close on the 24th with no further entries taken.

Late entries will be accepted from 18/10/25 with an additional \$25 per horse fee until: 24/10/2025

All entries are via Evo Events - <https://evoevents.co.nz/>

Entries will not be accepted after this date, nor during the show.

Full entry fee must be received before 5pm on the last day of entries, or entry will not be considered valid and the competitor may not be able to participate.

CONFIRMATION OF ENTRIES:

Confirmation of entries will be sent to each exhibitor once their entry has been received by the Secretary. If you have not received your confirmation within 10 working days after posting them please contact the office immediately.

GROUND FEES & LEVIES:

- RAS Equestrian levy of \$1.25 per class (is already included in the entry fee)
- Ground Fees of \$12.50 per exhibit to a maximum of \$50 must be paid with entries.

TICKETS:

Tickets will be emailed before the show. Please ensure you have a valid email on the entry form, if you would prefer tickets posted – please contact the Show office email AT thewaikatoshowsecretary@outlook.co.nz.

STABLE AND DAY PEN REQUIREMENTS:

Stable and Day Pen requirements must be stated on your entry form. The fee for Stables is \$50.00 each for the first night, \$20 for each consecutive night per stable including 1 bale of straw (extra straw \$20 per bale).

CLEANING: Any stables left in poor condition will incur a charge of \$50.00, please ensure that you leave them in good condition.

Day Pens - \$20 per day. **(Only for Stallions or Mares with Foals.)**

CAMPING: On the grounds must be booked with entries @ \$15 per person per night per site.

Portable pens are not permitted on the grounds.

STRAW: Straw will be provided in each box for the initial supply, any further straw required can be purchased from the Stabling Steward @ \$20 per bale.

HEIGHT CERTIFICATES:

A current RAS height/performance certificate must accompany the rider/handler in all classes where height is a requirement of eligibility.

***YOU MUST TAKE CERTIFICATES WITH YOU OR YOU WILL NOT
BE ALLOWED IN THE RING***

EXHIBIT NUMBER:

It is compulsory to display your Exhibit number (Exhibitor to provide) while in the Judging ring.

PUBLICATION OF EXHIBITOR'S NAME:

Entry in the Show entitles the Association to publish an Exhibitors name in result reports and distribute with Exhibitor lists.

PRIZE MONEY:

For all classes in the Horse Section.

The Waikato A& P Association reserve the right to replace prize money with product or vouchers.

The Committee reserve the right to combine classes should there be insufficient entries in any class. Prize money will be paid by direct banking within five weeks i.e. 05/12/2025. If you have not received your prize money by this date, please notify the office immediately. Notification must be made no later than the 16/12/25. Notification after this date will not be considered.

If promised sponsorship is not forthcoming, the Association cannot be held liable. All entry fees and prize money are GST inclusive.

ANY EXHIBITOR WHO FAILS TO COMPLY WITH THE RULES MAY FORFEIT THEIR PRIZEMONEY.

REFUNDING ENTRY FEES:

75% will be made on the presentation of a Doctor's or Veterinarian's Certificate at time of or within one week of the show and paid out after approval by the Council.

PROTEST:

Any protest must be made in writing within one (1) hour of the completion of the class, signed by the person making the complaint and delivered to the Secretary accompanied by \$200 cash (CHEQUES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED) which will be refunded should the protest be upheld.

ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY RULES & RECOMMENDATIONS:

- Ridden ponies must be 4 years of age or more.
- Three-year-old & under ponies may not be ridden in any classes at an A&P Show.
- The age limit of riders in pony classes is under 17 years with the exception of Novice Ponies.

NOTE: Ponies 148cm and under cannot compete in the Hack ring.

- Exhibitors in Flat rider classes must compete in the section they are eligible for.

SADDLERY & ACCESSORIES:

Any equipment that could force or tie a horse or pony into a frame, and thereby be deemed cruel or come under the mistreatment rule is not allowed on the grounds at affiliated Shows/Events. (See RAS Rule GR5)

STALLIONS:

- All stallions and colts must be shown in a bit with the exception of foals and Miniature Horses and Shetland Pony Yearlings. A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion /colt's owner/exhibitor/ competitor.
- A Steward will order any stallion/colt considered out of control or to be causing undue disquiet to other horses from the ring without recourse from the stallion/colt's owner/exhibitor/competitor.
- It is compulsory for all stallions and colts, except foals, to wear two (2) official 'S' identification badges, one attached to each side of their bridle, at all Shows/Events at all times. The rider/handler must also wear two (2) RAS official armbands (one on each arm) when in the ring. 'S' badges to be purchased from RAS Head Office or ESNZ; armbands from RAS Head Office.
- Handlers and Riders of stallions/colts must wear an approved Hi Viz Vest at Shows/Events when outside the showing ring. Vests can be purchased from RAS Head Office.

YELLOW CARD:

This Show supports the RAS In-Line Resolution Process Policy. A Yellow or Red Card CAN be issued, in cases of offences in respect of abuse of animals or inappropriate behavior as per the RAS Constitution and the RAS Rules & Regulations / Bylaws including the Equestrian Rulebook, the RAS affiliated Show / registered Measuring Stand and their grounds and their duly appointed delegates may deliver to the person responsible a Yellow Warning Card (either immediately or within 10 days of the show) which suspends any penalty until possible new offences.

SUMMARY OF RAS RESOLUTION PROCESS:

The full process can be found on the RAS website www.ras.org.nz/about/our-rules-regulations-and-policies/

The principle behind the process is to deal with the matter as it comes to hand and in most cases, it should be dealt with directly by the Show. If the matter is in regard to an RAS official, the show is to forward the concern on to the RAS Operations Manager to handle in an appropriate manner.

CLEAN SPORT:

The Rules of the Royal A&P Society New Zealand in regard to Clean Sport apply. Competitors are advised that tests for forbidden substances may be carried out during the Show/Event and that testing of all animals is at risk of the person responsible.

FALL OF RIDER:

If a rider has a fall or suspected head injury, at any time at a RAS affiliated Show/Event in the: competition ring/arena, practice/warmup/collecting ring/arena; or elsewhere within the grounds of where the show/event is being convened, the rider must be removed from the activity and checked by the show/event's nominated First Aid service/personnel and be given the 'all-clear' before the rider is permitted to re-mount and continue riding at the show/event.

AGES:

Age of Riders/Handler/Horses/Ponies are as at 1 August 2025.

FORBIDDEN SUBSTANCE:

Any substance capable of affecting the speed, stamina, courage or conduct of a horse, pony, donkey or mule by its action upon the central or peripheral nervous system or the cardio-vascular, respiratory, alimentary, digestive, musculoskeletal or urogenital systems.

ARREARS:

No person who is in arrears regarding entry fees, subscriptions, or any other Show/Event charge is ineligible to compete at any affiliated Show/Event. Proof of payment will be required before any restriction is lifted.

LEGAL LIABILITY: SUPERVISION & CONTROL OF ANIMAL/S:

The Association's insurance policy does not cover Competitors or Exhibitors.

Each exhibitor must always supervise and control their animals and shall be liable for any hazard created or accident, illness or damage caused by the action of themselves or their animals at the Showgrounds. Exhibitors must comply with the appropriate Animal Legislation and the Health and Safety in Employment Act 2016.

No person is permitted in any judging ring without express permission from the Head Steward of that ring. Only persons directly responsible for an Exhibit are permitted in the marshalling area.

TEST AND TAG:

Due to 2016 H&S Regulations and because Claudelands Events Centre is a business property, all electrical leads and electrical appliances brought on to the property must have a current Test N Tag Electrical Certificate. Any lead or appliance not compliant will need to be tested and certified on site at the owner's cost.

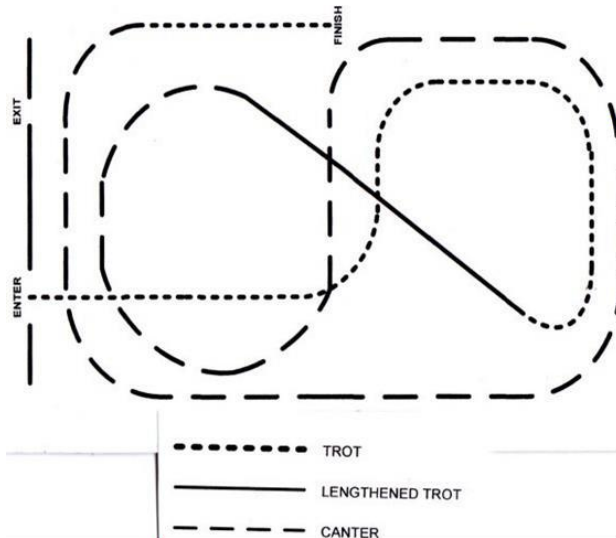

Whilst they do not possess the show quality conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride, with impeccable manners.

A pleasure mount is not an inexperienced mount with show quality conformation who is destined for the open show ring.

You do not need to be registered with the Society to compete in this ring.

However, to qualify for points prizes & the National Title Show you and your mount must be registered with the NZ Equestrian Pleasure Horse Society prior to the show.

- No spurs and whips must be under 75cm

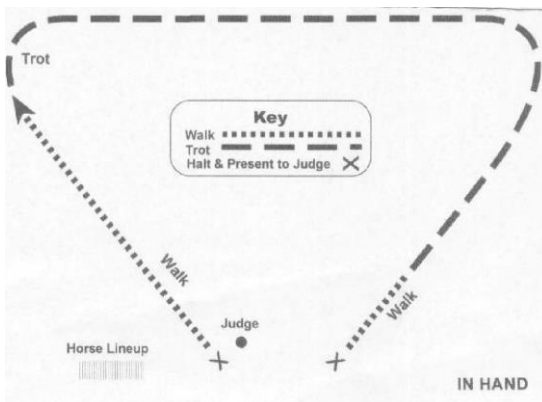
